Safeguarding Children in the Community

I am aware that there have been reports recently about a man who has been seen approaching children in the local parks. The man usually starts to engage with children by talking to them and trying to join in their games. We are working with our local PCSO, Keith Bartlett, in relation to this. This is particularly concerning to us as we know that many of our older children attend the parks with their friends unaccompanied.

The last report of this individual being seen in our area was during the half term break. Cheshire Police are keen to have a conversation with this individual but as yet, they have been unable to speak to him as he has left the park before they arrive.

PCSO Bartlett has provided the following advice. If parents/carers are concerned regarding any individual in the local parks, they should contact the police and then remain highly vigilant for their children and others. Parents/carers should not approach the individual but wait for Cheshire Police to arrive. Thank you for your cooperation and vigilance. We will continue to work in partnership with PCSO Bartlett and Cheshire Police.

Learning Hub

We are so proud to host a weekly Learning Hub at our school. This has been running over recent months at Hoole with parents/carers attending engaging in free courses organised by the Cheshire West & Chester Adult Learning Unit.

Parents/carers are invited to enrol for the latest course which focuses on English skills. The free course starts at school on 7th March and runs every Tuesday morning until 23rd May 2023 from 9.15am – 11.30am.

The course covers areas including writing, punctuation, sentence structure, speaking and listening. This would be ideal for anyone wishing to brush up their own skills and knowledge to be equipped to support their child's learning at home.

The course is run in a friendly environment in the school hall. Refreshments are provided and this is a great opportunity to connect with other parents/carers.



Phonics Workshops

This year, to support the teaching of early reading we have introduced an exciting new phonics programme called 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds'.

Parents and Carers of pupils in Reception and Year 1 are invited to a 'Little Wandle' phonics and reading evening here at school.

The workshops will enable parents and carers to find out how we teach reading from the early stages and how this then feeds in to a child's journey to becoming a fluent, confident reader. We will show parents and carers what a phonics lesson in school looks like for the children as well as play some games to show you how the children learn. We will also give plenty of tips about how you can give valuable support when reading with your child(ren) at home.

All children in Year One will take part in the National Phonics Screening Check in the Summer term. We will explain what this is, how it works and how we can work together to prepare your child(ren) for it. Please note that the workshops are adults only.
