Message from Headteacher

They enjoyed learning how to tie different knots, showing resilience supporting younger children to do this. The activities included a 'Search and Rescue Exercise' in the woods, climbing and an obstacle course, many team challenges and sports activities.

One of the highlights was a 'Hunt the Leader' game where children had to find different detectives hiding in the grounds- teachers and leaders enjoyed dressing up too! We relished a campfire in the dark, singing and toasting marshmallows!

The children also made an Easter garden and explored the case of the Empty Tomb which was dramatically presented by Mr Avery and Lynsey, gathering the evidence for where the body of Jesus had gone on Easter Sunday. We sang a new song with Reverend Sam, and we will be sharing this with the whole school this week. Professor Klaus also flew in for a brief appearance but his current whereabouts is again unknown!

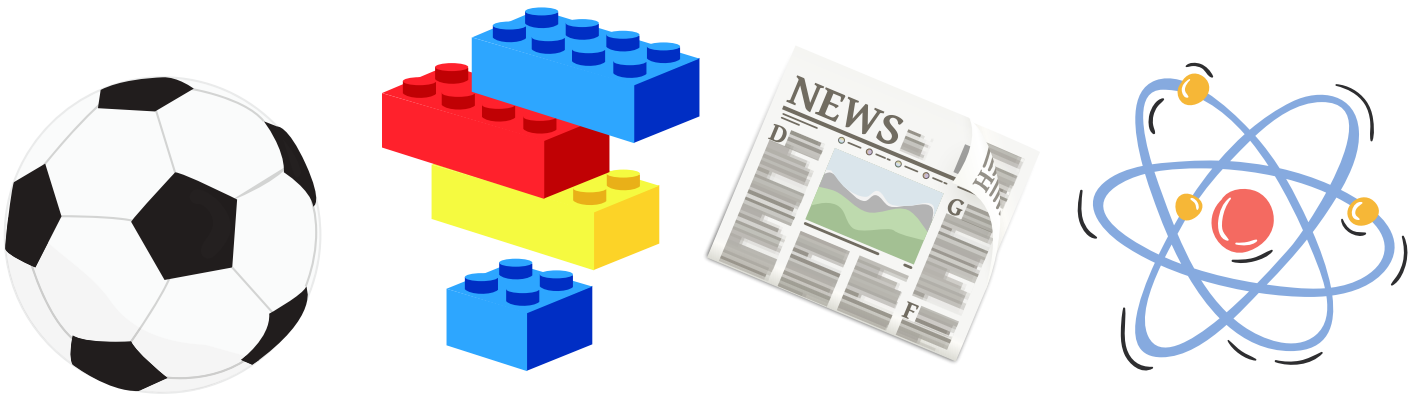
Summer Term Clubs

We want to ensure that all children have the opportunity to attend a club if they haven't registered before.

Please note that most of the clubs will run all term (until the week before we break up in July) unless otherwise stated. Please let the School Office know if your child registers for a club and then changes their mind so that we can pass the place onto another child.
