Head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families. They do not have anything to do with dirty hair and are picked up by head-tohead contact.

The only way to be sure someone has head lice is by finding live lice. You can do this by combing their hair with a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb). You can buy these online or at pharmacies.

Head lice can make your head feel itchy and like something is moving in your hair.

Treat head lice as soon as you spot them. You can treat head lice without seeing a GP. You should check everyone in the house and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day.

There's nothing you can do to prevent head lice but you can help stop them spreading by wet or dry combing regularly to catch them early.

Medicated lotions or sprays kill head lice in all types of hair, and you can buy them from pharmacies, supermarkets or online.

Head lice should die within a day. Some lotions and sprays come with a comb to remove dead lice and eggs.

Forest School

Harvey was awarded Star of the Week for performing so well in a game of rounders at his sports club.




