"I felt like I really enjoyed it because everyone was watching and cheering for Liverpool. I had a good time."


"We were singing at the top of our voices to cheer them on."

"It inspired me to try my best when I am playing."




#### Year 5 Trip to Xplore!

#### **Oh Christmas Tree!**






Be sure to visit Hamilton Street Church Christmas Tree Festival this December and view our beautiful Christmas Tree!

The Global Ambassadors are working hard to set up our 3rd initiative which will be introduced in January 2024.




#### Author Visit

#### **Christmas Services**
