Pupils in Year 2 will sit these tests to inform and support their teacher's assessment. They will be completed in such a way as to avoid causing stress for children as they only contribute one small piece of the jigsaw we put together to assess children's overall attainment and progress in Year 2.		

We also have lots of exciting events planned for the coming term in addition to our usual summer activities. Year 2 will have their big day out and school sleepover and our wonderful Parent Teacher Associations are preparing for our Summer Fair on Friday 7th June.

I have written to families today to inform you that we have arranged to hire a swimming pool for the period 7th May – 24th May. The pool hire includes full-time support from qualified swimming teachers and lifeguards.

During this period, we aim that all pupils will have the opportunity for swimming lessons or sessions in small groups (no more than twelve pupils) to increase water confidence.

There is no charge to parents/carers for these sessions.

We will provide further information in due course about when your child will engage in swimming sessions. Please complete the survey on School Spider to advise us of your child's swimming ability, by Wednesday 24th April.

On Monday afternoon, classes learned about our focus value for the half term - Endurance.

Our bible verses are Hebrews 12 verse 1. Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us and James 1:2-4:

"Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing".

Children in Reception and Key Stage 1 learnt about the story of Ruth and Key Stage 2 learnt about Joseph.

Each year group explored different people in history who have had to endure - Reception learnt how Beethoven went deaf but still wrote music, Year 1 learnt about Michaelangelo and how long it took him to produce the artwork he did. Year 2 learnt about Abede Bikila - the barefoot marathon runner. Children in Key Stage 2 learnt about Charlotte Bronte, Thomas Edison, Emmeline Pankhurst and Jesse Owens.

All these people made a difference in the world, but had to endure trials or difficulties to accomplish them. We will be considering this half term what we can learn from them and how their endurance can encourage us to endure when things are difficult.

PE Lessons

- Wellies/Outdoor shoes
- Gloves/hats if the weather is cold

What incredibly determined pupils we have - we are so proud of you all! Keep letting your lights shine.


