Children joined together for a range of activities including worship, songs, reflection and prayer spaces.


The event was a great success and something we plan to make an annual event at our school. Thank you to the Ethos Ambassadors and all involved!



Oh Christmas Tree!


We are very excited to be involved with Chester Cathedral's Christmas Tree Festival again this year!
