Message from Headteacher

Lunch times

I would like to clarify some information regarding lunchtimes for parents/carers of pupils in Key Stage 2. Years 4,5 and 6 come into the hall for lunch on a rota basis. The last group to come into the dining hall is in by 12.40pm at the latest. Lunchtime ends at 1.15pm for Year 4, 5 & 6.

Children are welcome to remain in the lunch hall eating as long as they need to. Whilst staff in the dining hall begin to clean tables and tidy up once all children have been served, no pupil is ever prevented from finishing their school meal or eating all of their packed lunch.

Based on the dinner orders collected in the morning by class teachers and submitted to the school kitchen each day, sufficient food is prepared and available for all children. The kitchen team always produce a surplus of food to be provided in the event of children dropping food, spillages or forgotten lunchboxes.

If any families have any specific concerns or issues relating to the lunchtime experience at our school, please make an appointment to meet with me regarding this via the School Office.

Congratulations again to our kitchen team for attaining five stars in the recent inspection by Environmental Health.

Message from Headteacher

The UK SEPSIS Trust

I have been made aware of the work of the food retailer, Iceland's charitable arm Iceland Foods Charitable Foundation (IFCF) with the UK Sepsis Trust. This partnership has reached millions of people with potentially life-saving information, working towards the vision of ending preventable deaths from sepsis.

Sepsis is a life-threatening condition that arises when the body's response to an infection injures its own tissues and organs. It occurs when the body's immune system – which normally helps to protect us and fight infection – goes into overdrive. Although treatable with antibiotics, sepsis can lead to shock, multiple organ failure and sometimes death, especially if not recognised early and treated promptly.

Sepsis is indiscriminate: while it primarily affects very young children and older adults, and is also more common in people with underlying health conditions, it can sometimes be triggered in those who are otherwise fit and healthy.

Sepsis always starts with an infection, and can be triggered by any infection including chest infections and UTIs. It is not known why some people develop sepsis in response to these common infections whereas others don't. Five people die with sepsis every hour in the UK. The aim of The UK Sepsis Trust is to educate people to recognise the signs and symptoms of sepsis so that early identification and treatment support a reduction in preventable deaths from sepsis.

CHILDREN

A child may have sepsis if he or she:

- Is breathing very fast
- · Has a 'fit' or convulsion
- · Looks mottled, bluish, or pale
- Has a rash that does not fade when you press it
- Is very lethargic or difficult to wake
- Feels abnormally cold to touch

ADULTS

An adult may have sepsis if they show any of these signs:

Slurred speech or confusion

Extreme shivering or muscle pain

Passing no urine (in a day)

Severe breathlessness

t feels like you're going to die

Skin mottled or discoloured

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SUSPECT SEPSIS:

Call III or contact your GP if you're worried about an infection.

Call 999 or visit A&E if someone has one of the sepsis symptoms.

If you work for a large company, it would be much appreciated if you could check if they have any community schemes which may support us in our fundraising.


In the past, we have received a significant sum from MBNA which enabled us to purchase additional banks of I-pads.

Any ideas for grants or bids we could submit would be appreciated.


PTA News
