

This qualification is aimed at equipping parents and carers with essential knowledge about various Specific Learning Difficulties, such as Autism, Dyslexia, Attention Deficit, and Hyperactivity Disorder. It focuses on understanding the diagnosis process and providing effective strategies for offering support. This course is tailored to meeting the needs of parents and carers looking to enhance their awareness and expertise in addressing the specific learning challenges their children may face.
