

## Message from Headteacher

#### Thank you!

Your children have returned to school looking so happy and smart.

All of the pupils I have spoken to have been so excited to share some news from the school holiday. It is wonderful to welcome them back this week.

Thank you again for all of the Christmas messages, cards and gifts for our staff team. Your support and generosity is very much appreciated by us all.

#### Can you help us?

Over the last two terms, we have provided a document called an Individual Learning Plan to all pupils. The Individual Learning Plan (ILP) outlines the child's targets, details of any additional support being offered in school to support achievement of the target and how families may support their child at home.

Your child should have brought home their Individual Learning Plan and shared it with you. The last ILPs were sent out in the first half of last term, around the end of September. We are always keen to improve school systems to ensure that they work efficiently and make a difference.

We are reviewing the Individual Learning Plan system in school. If you have a few minutes, please would you complete a short survey to give us your views and feedback to inform our review. #### Smart watches and jewellery

### Message from Headteacher

### Reading

We love reading and believe every child can become a fluent reader! Reading opens doors and inspires imagination. Learning to read fluently means a child can access the full curriculum and will help them become independent learners. The fundamental tool for reading is Phonics. At Hoole CE Primary School, we follow the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Phonics Scheme, with children in Reception through to Year 2 having daily phonics sessions to embed these skills. We also want children to have a love of reading which is why we have plenty of opportunities for shared reading and listening to stories across the school.

We teach phonics for around 30 minutes a day in Key Stage 1, building from shorter sessions at the beginning of Reception. In Year 2, phonics sessions will become more spelling focused as the year goes on. Reading Practice sessions in Reception and Year 1 happen 3 times a week. These are taught by a fully trained adult to small groups of approximately six children. Books are matched to the children's secure phonic knowledge and are monitored closely by the class teacher. Children will take the book used in these sessions home to read with their parents and celebrate their reading.

Children will exit the Little Wandle Phonics Scheme during Year 2 with lessons moving on to a spelling focus. Children will continue to take part in Guided Reading lessons planned for by their class teacher each week. Children who are still progressing through the Little Wandle Phonics Scheme will continue to do so with support outlined by your child's class teacher.

Children at Hoole CE Primary will no longer have a coloured book band for their reading books. To

promote a love of reading, children from year 2 onwards (once finished Little Wandle Phonics) will select their own reading book from their very own class library. Children will be supported in selecting their book if and when required. This is a research backed approach to support the development of fluency, confidence and a love for reading.

### Reading Reward System

We are so pleased with how many of our children are reading the expected number of times at home and want all children to be rewarded for their efforts! Starting this term in Key Stage 2, you will see 'superstar reader' stickers in the back of their reading record. We will still stamp in the

front. The children will be able to 'spend' their stickers in blocks of five in our 'Sticker Swap Shop'. They will also have the chance to save their stickers to get an item worth ten or 15 stickers.

We hope this incentive will encourage all of the children to read the expected number of times for their year groups to collect their stickers.

Ruby has made progress in her swimming lessons, moving from Seals to Sharks!


Ziggy won a medal walking a HUGE 100 miles for charity. He raised an incredible £540 for Alder Hey Children's Hospital!




#### Cheshire Phoenix Season Ticket

We have been very kindly gifted a school season ticket for Cheshire Phoenix Basketball matches.


