### Support for Parents/Carers - Behaviour Management

As a school, we take a proactive approach to supporting our families with issues which may impact on family life and wellbeing.

We are aware that managing children's behaviour at home can sometimes be challenging. During periods of difficulty, parents/carers can feel isolated and struggle with the answers to the challenging behaviour they may face.

I am writing to inform you about two courses which are running in school over coming weeks aimed at supporting parents and carers.

### Parent Talk in the Primary Years

This course is being run by staff from our school and HETTY Nursery (Mrs Jeffs, Mrs Bowes, Mrs Chester and Miss Cooper).


It will be an informal opportunity for parents/carers to engage with a range of topics related to managing behaviour in a supportive environment, with opportunities for discussion with staff and other families.

Sessions take place in school on the following dates:

- Wednesday 5th March
- Tuesday 29th April
- Tuesday 13th May
- Tuesday 10th June
- Tuesday 8th July

The course will cover areas including setting boundaries, building communication and preparing children for the outside world.

There is no charge for this course. To book a place, please email, telephone or speak to the school office. All are welcome to attend, even if you only wish to attend one or two sessions.



### **Understanding Behaviour that Challenges Course**

I am writing to remind families that we have a brilliant course running in school every Friday starting from Friday 28th February.

The course is designed to increase skills in understanding and managing challenging behaviour. Learning will focus on investigating underlying reasons that can affect behaviour and strategies

for promoting positive behaviour.

The course is delivered in a comfortable space with refreshments available. Please do not feel anxious or daunted by learning alongside others as the environment is very relaxed and friendly. The course runs from 9.30am – 2.30pm every Friday.

### Early Help Navigator Service

Our local Early help Navigator, Zuzanna, will be in school next Thursday morning (6th March).

Early Help Navigators are able to help parents/carers navigate what help and support is available in the local area; offer help, support and advice on a variety of issues; signpost to local and national services or help families to compete forms. They offer a listening ear and have knowledge of what services are available in the local area.

# Proposed Academy Conversion - Parent/Carer & Community Consultation

You will be aware that we recently held a four-week consultation period for parents/carers and community partners to give their views on a proposal for the school to convert to an academy with Chester Diocese Learning Trust.

The formal consultation period ended on 21st February.

Parents/carers will shortly receive information collated as a result of the consultation process. This will include all of the questions asked with responses provided.

This is being formulated at present and will be sent out in due course.



### School Bank

The bank opens every Thursday for children to come and pay into their savings account. Our school bank is a great way of encouraging children to develop positive habits with money management. A school bank is an account which your child could take ownership for, paying in a small amount each week, or saving a little chunk of birthday or Christmas money. An account can be opened with as little as £1 and pays a very competitive rate of interest.

We are providing £2 for every child who do not yet have an account to open one. Any child who already has an account opened will receive a £1 boost to their savings.

This has been wholly subsidised by a grant we obtained as part of our work towards a Financial Excellence Award.

We have also launched a monthly draw for families with children who have an open account to win £10.

We understand that many children have savings accounts and investments. Often, though, these are managed by adults on the child's behalf and they have little understanding of how savings can grow over time.

All parents/carers need to do to support their child opening an account is to fill in a short form and show your child's passport or birth certificate and show your own passport, driving licence or birth certificate, a bank statement or household bill

### We need your feedback!

# Holidays during term time: What the new rules mean for me



From September 2024, the new National Framework for issuing penalty notices will apply.



### As a school, we fully appreciate the financial difficulties that some parents face when booking holidays, particularly during school holidays.

However, school is duty bound to comply with the regulations set by the local authority and national protocols.

A Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) is a fine which may be issued for taking children out of school during term time for the purpose of leisure or recreation.

### **Second Offence**

(Within 3 years of the first offence)

Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second Penalty Notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first notice. The second Penalty Notice will be charge at:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days (Unpaid Penalty Notices after 28 days may result in a prosecution)

### Example: We are a family of 2 children and 2 parents.

Child 1 child 2 Parent 1 Parent 2 £160 £160 £320 £320 = £640

The 10 school week period may span different terms or school years (e.g. 2 sessions of unauthorised absence in the Summer Term and a further 8 within the Autumn Term).

### **First Offence**

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for a Term Time Holiday or Irregular School Attendance, the Penalty Notice will be charged

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parents, per child if paid within 21 days

Example: I'm a single parent of 2 children and we want to go on holiday for a week in term time.

Your holiday will not be authorised and you should speak to school before booking because your child will miss 5 school days, you will be issued a penalty notice fine.

Child 1 child 2 Parent £160 £160 £320

The initial fine is £320 but if paid within 21 days it will be reduced to £160

### **Third Offence**

(Within 3 years of the First Offence)

The third time that an offence is committed for either a term time holiday and/or irregular attendance, a Penalty Notice will not be issued. The case may be proceeded straight to prosecution/court.

The 3 year period can cover primary and secondary school periods eg: first offence in year 5 of primary and 2nd offence in year 7.


