PUNCTUALITY MATTERS

We are keen to explore how we can offer more help to families where punctuality causes stress.

If you would like to discuss how school may support, please contact Mrs Williamson, our Attendance Officer, or Mrs Robertson, our Learning Mentor.

Some of the ways we can help include developing reward charts to support children's organisation in the morning and, for example, bedtime routines.



If your child has arrived after the gates have closed, please accompany them to the school office. If they arrive after 9am, we may ask the reason for them arriving late. Please do not be offended. Our rationale for asking is so that we can think about how we can develop our approaches in school to help children and their families.

Punctuality Codes

We use two main codes to show punctuality. These are the U Code and the L Code.

The L Code is used when children arrive between 9-9.19am. This is shown as an L on the child's attendance record to show that they arrived after registers have closed. The L code does not reduce the child's overall percentage. When children arrive after 8.50am when gates are closed, they come into school via the main door by the office.

The U Code is used from 9.20am. The U code does affect the child's overall attendance percentage. The overall percentage is reduced by the U code which indicates that a child has arrived significantly after registers have closed.

In the same way that we track attendance on a daily, weekly and half termly basis, L and U codes are also reviewed to ensure that we are doing all we can to support children to attend on time.

Medical Appointments

We appreciate that medical appointments are often issued with no flexibility on the time families are given. We understand that this is particularly the case where children have hospital or specialist appointments.

If your child has a medical or dental appointment, if they come into school beforehand, they are marked as present and then the parent/carers signs them out. This does not affect their overall attendance percentage.

Where a child has a medical appointment at, for example, 9.30am and does not come into school beforehand, the M Code is recorded. This means that the child's overall attendance is reduced.

Worship News

Class Worship

Our class based worship this week has looked at the importance of a morning routine in setting us up well for the day. Children learnt of a trial starting in April in some schools offering free breakfast clubs. Children reflected on the rule of law and how rules support fairness and wellbeing as well as learning that if schools are taking part in the trial, they need to follow the guidelines given.

They discussed the protected characteristic of age and how all people should have access to the things they need regardless of how old or young they are.

Children learnt that the life and teachings of Jesus encourage us to show care and compassion towards others so that everyone can thrive.

Our Bible verse was Mark 1:35 'Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed.

Collective Worship

This week we had a very special visitor in our Monday worship. Jesse, a missionary from OMF International (Overseas Missionary Fellowship) came to talk to us about the work he and his family are doing in Mongolia.

He shared with the children pictures of Mongolia and told us that sometimes the temperature there is so cold that your eyelashes freeze and stick together. Many people live in 'gers' or yurts and have a fire in the middle of it which they use to heat the home. We learnt that children in his city do not have the same access to play centres as our children do, and often where they play is dangerous and the air is also very polluted.

There are very few facilities for children who have additional needs. His charity is working on a project to develop a centre for education, play and community support. Children learnt that only a small minority of people in Mongolia are Christians and that many people are forbidden by their families to share their faith.

Children were all given a Mongolian bank note, (worth less than one penny) as a reminder of all that they learned about Mongolia and to encourage them, if they wish, to pray for the children in Mongolia and the work that Jesse is doing.






This week, Year 2 welcomed members of their family to All Saints Church to showcase their fantastic work from the year so far!
