English

Toys In Space

- Join words and clauses using 'and '
- Add suffixes to verbs where no change is needed to the root
- Change the meaning of verbs and adjectives by adding prefix 'un'
- Punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark
- To write a fantasy story about some toys who are taken onto a spaceship. They will be changing the characters in the story

Goldilocks and Just the One Bear

- Use simple description
- Sequence sentences to form short narratives (link ideas or events by pronoun)
- Use a capital letter for places and days of the week
- To write a new version of the story with a new character or new setting

Science

Plants

- Know that a plant has roots, a stem, leaves, a flower
- Know the function of each part of the plant
- Know that a tree has roots, a trunk, branches and leaves
- Know that there are different types of plants and trees and can name some common plants and trees
- Know that some trees keep their leaves all year while other trees drop their leaves during autumn and grow them again during spring

Mathematics

Money

• Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes

Numbers beyond 20

• Recognising numbers to 100 and the value of these numbers

Multiplication and division

 Solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher

Length, height and capacity

- Compare, describe and solve practical problems for: lengths and heights
- Compare, describe and solve practical problems for mass/weight
- Compare, describe and solve practical problems for capacity and volume
- Measure and begin to record the following: lengths and heights, mass/weight, capacity and volume, time (hours, minutes, seconds)

History

Local History - Learning about our city

- Know that the town crier is a person who speaks to people in Chester
- Know that the town crier makes his/her announcements from Chester Cross in Chester
- Know that lots of people come to hear the town crier announcements

Religious Education

Happy Human

- Know that Humanists that the world formed naturally which started with the Big Bang and that people evolved
- Know that Humanists do not believe that God exists
- Know that the Humanist symbol is called the Happy Human, designed in 1965
- Know that Humanists believe in the Golden Rule - Treat others how you would like to be treated
- Know that it is important to treat everyone equally

Islam

- Who do Muslims say Allah is
- Know that Muslims believe in One God, they call him Allah, he has 99 beautiful names
- Know that Muhammed is the last prophet of Islam

Judaism

- Know that Jews follow Judaism and believe in one God
- Know that the Torah is the Holy book for Jews and is same as the Old Testament of the Bible
- Know that Christians believe the God of the Old Testament sent Jesus to save them

Geography

- Know where our food comes from
- Know that there are four countries in the United Kingdom – England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland
- Know that the capital cities of the United Kingdom are London, Cardiff, Edinburgh and Belfast
- Know that the four main points of the compass are North, South, East and West
- Know that maps, atlases and globes can be used to locate countries, continents and oceans

- To manipulate an image by adding text to it

Common uses of technology Bar Codes

- Know that technology is used in many different ways outside of school and I can describe some
- Know that a barcode is used to identify different products and that the same products have the same barcode. A barcode links to information about a product
