SIAMS Inspection

Families will be aware that we welcomed an inspector to school again this week.
Following our highly positive Ofsted inspection at the end of the January, we were subject to a SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican & Methodist Schools) inspection.

The SIAMS inspection explores ways in which the school's Christian vision and values drives its work and enables the school to live up to its foundation as a Church school.

I am pleased to report that the SIAMS inspector was very positive about the work of our school. She acknowledged the welcoming, nurturing and supportive culture at Hoole and was impressed by the passion and enthusiasm of the adults and children she spoke to during the visit.

SIAMS reports are usually published within three to four weeks of the date of inspection. I will share the report with you as soon as I receive the finalised version.

I am so pleased that following our highly successful Ofsted inspection, we have this opportunity to celebrate that the strength of our school has been recognised by another official body.

Shakespeare Club Shows

Medication in School

Parents/carers will be aware that we can administer antihistamine (Piriton/Piriteze) and pain relief medication (Calpol) in school if needed, provided that families have authorised this. If your child needs medication regularly, please bring in a supply of medication for your child so that emergency school stock is not diminished.

Please may I request that parents/carers ensure that children do not bring Calpol tablets into school in their pockets or bags Any Calpol taken in school needs to be administered and recorded by a member of staff.

Be Summer Safe

With the summer months on their way, the pollen count is beginning to rise and the sun is peeping through a bit more!

With that in mind, please can families ensure that they apply sunscreen to children prior to arriving at school and provide a suitable sun hat on very sunny days.

Children should also have a water bottle with fresh water each day. Also, if your child suffers from hay fever, please drop off suitable antihistamine medication and the School Office Team will be happy to administer it when you child requires it, with your written consent.

Class Worship

In this week's class based worship, we learnt about the bin strikes that are have been going on in Birmingham since March. We discussed the value of mutual respect - how everyone has the right to be treated with respect - both that workers have the right for their work to be respected and children have the right to grow up in a safe and clean environment.

When considering protected characteristics, we discussed that men and women can be refuse collectors and that it is wrong to say certain jobs are only for men, or only for women. We also talked about the many different jobs people can do to take care of our local communities.

John F Kennedy said "We must find time to stop and thank the people who make a difference in our lives."

We looked at the bible passage from 1 Corinthians 12 where Paul reminds the church that whilst they are all different, they are also all part of a body, something bigger than themselves. We learnt that we all need each other to make the world a better place.

- What happens if we do not keep spaces clean?
- Who do you see keeping our local area clean? Could you thank them?

Have you ever been part of a team where everyone has a different task? How did respect help you succeed?

In what ways can we show responsibility for our environment and for each other?










Friday Assembly
