### Shakespeare Club

Last week, the Year 5 & 6 Shakespeare Club were in action. They performed Macbeth to packed houses on Wednesday and Friday evenings. I was astounded by their confidence in presenting a lengthy play with such finesse. Within the script, there was a great deal of the actual words Shakespeare wrote woven in. The children coped with this with ease and really rose to the challenge, performing with maturity beyond their years.

Before half term, the Year 3 & 4 pupils from Shakespeare Club presented their version of Romeo and Juliet. It was wonderful to see such young children performing tricky Shakespearean language with such stage presence.

On a personal note, I want to thank every child who attended Shakespeare Clubs this year. They were fantastic to work with – so enthusiastic and determined that the plays would be successful. I am so proud and genuinely humbled by the effort they invested into learning their lines. We talk in our school about how hard work, combined with perseverance, courage and enthusiasm goes a long way. This is the perfect example of this and an experience I hope the children will draw on in times of anxiety, fear or self-doubt. They were all absolutely tremendous!

Over recent years, children have enjoyed performances of Hamlet, Romeo & Juliet, Much Ado About Nothing and Macbeth all presented by Shakespeare Club. We also welcomed a visiting theatre group who performed The Tempest for our school family.

Our recent SIAMs report highlighted the commitment of our school to our vision "Let your light shine." Shakespeare Club is one of our strategies for supporting children to approach the next phase of their education with confidence, so they can let their lights shine brightly.

When pupils leave us and progress to secondary school, they will encounter Shakespeare's works at some point, and this can be daunting given the difficult language and storylines in the plays. Pupils at Hoole are already familiar with many of Shakespeare's plays before they leave us at the end of Year six. We hope that this gives them the confidence to approach lessons with confidence and motivation to show what they know so they can shine like little laser beams.

We welcomed PCSO Jayne Lockwood into school on Monday. Next week, on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June, pupils in Key Stage 2 will enjoy a further visit from representatives of Cheshire Police. Children will have the opportunity to chat with officers and access the Safety Van, which supports learning about a range of issues, including open water safety.

The Community Clothing Cabin is open every school day from 8am to 4.30pm.



### **Swimming Lessons**

Swimming lessons have begun successfully this week and the children have already made a significant improvement in their water confidence.

During every swimming session, there ise a swimming teacher and trained lifeguard on duty. School staff also support sessions. There is a range of equipment such as armbands available to support children who are learning to swim or building up their water confidence.

We have organised children into groups based on the information provided by parents/carers about their swimming ability. You should have received a rota for next week in your child's book bag and via email.

### **Equipment Needed**

Your child will need to bring the following: Essential

- Swimming costume
- Towel
- Carrier bag to put wet clothing into after swimming

For religious or cultural reasons, if your child needs to, they may enter the pool wearing leggings, long or short sleeved t- shirts or shorts either over or instead of a swimming costume. This is also an option for older pupils or those who may be body conscious.

Optional or if you have them

- Goggles if they wish to wear them
- A swimming hat if they have one please note that we have these in school so, if your child does not currently have one, they can borrow one from school.

Recommended but not essential (please don't go out and buy these specially)

- Flip flops, crocs or similar shoes which can be slipped on to walk from the changing areas to the pool
- A dressing gown or long hoodie to wear walking to and from the pool.

### PLEASE, PLEASE ENSURE THAT ANY CLOTHING YOUR CHILD BRINGS IS CLEARLY MARKED WITH THEIR NAMES IN.

If your child has long hair, please ensure that it is tied back on the days they are swimming. This will speed up getting swimming hats on.

If your child is a confident swimmer, they will participate in life saving and other challenges. Your child may need to bring, for example, clothing to swim in. If this is the case, you will be notified.

If you have any further questions or wish to discuss arrangements further, please speak to your child's class teacher.





Our Summer Term Parent's Evenings will take place before we break up for the summer holidays.




Please ensure that all children come to school every day with a water bottle, cap and wearing sun cream (weather dependent).

### Be Summer Safe

Please can families ensure that they apply sunscreen to children prior to arriving at school and provide a suitable sun hat on very sunny days.

Children should also have a water bottle with fresh water each day. Also, if your child suffers from hay fever, please drop off suitable antihistamine medication and the School Office Team will be happy to administer it when you child requires it, with your written consent.

# Holidays during term time: What the new rules mean for me



From September 2024, the new National Framework for issuing penalty notices will apply.



As a school, we fully appreciate the financial difficulties that some parents face when booking holidays, particularly during school holidays.

However, school is duty bound to comply with the regulations set by the local authority and national protocols.

A Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) is a fine which may be issued for taking children out of school during term time for the purpose of leisure or recreation.

### **Second Offence**

(Within 3 years of the first offence)

Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second Penalty Notice to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first notice. The second Penalty Notice will be charge at:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days (Unpaid Penalty Notices after 28 days may result in a prosecution)

### Example: We are a family of 2 children and 2 parents.

Child 1 child 2 Parent 1 Parent 2

£160 = £640£160 £320 £320

The 10 school week period may span different terms or school years (e.g. 2 sessions of unauthorised absence in the Summer Term and a further 8 within the Autumn Term).

### **First Offence**

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for a Term Time Holiday or Irregular School Attendance, the Penalty Notice will be charged

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parents, per child if paid within 21 days

Example: I'm a single parent of 2 children and we want to go on holiday for a week in term time.

Your holiday will not be authorised and you should speak to school before booking because your child will miss 5 school days, you will be issued a penalty notice fine.

Child 1 child 2 **Parent** £160 £160 £320

The initial fine is £320 but if paid within 21 days it will be reduced to £160


### **Third Offence**

(Within 3 years of the First Offence)

The third time that an offence is committed for either a term time holiday and/or irregular attendance, a Penalty Notice will not be issued. The case may be proceeded straight to prosecution/court.

The 3 year period can cover primary and secondary school periods eg: first offence in year 5 of primary and 2nd offence in year 7.


