

# Message from Headteacher

#### Survey - Mobile Phones

Over this academic year, I have become increasingly concerned about the impact of mobile phones on pupils' self-esteem, emotional wellbeing and relationships.

Every year, staff spend an increasing amount of time addressing issues which have arisen due to mobile phone use and communications using technology, such as messaging services or chat functions on games. Nationally, the impact of social media and technology on children's mental health and wellbeing is acknowledged as a growing concern.

Whilst we invest heavily in promoting the safe and respectful use of technology both at home and at school, we understand that we have very limited control on how children engage with each other and the world online. Within our own school family, we are aware of pupils being contacted by unknown adults, including via popular games such as Roblox, which is presented as being child friendly. We understand that many families share our concern.

I am keen to gain parental views on the issue of mobile phones in school. This will support a review of our current approach.

Currently, only children in Year 5 and 6 may bring phones into school. They are collected in the morning on arrival at school and distributed when children leave at the end of the school day. Pupils do not access them during the school day. Over this year, we have worked to reduce phones in school by asking families to consider if bring a phone is necessary, particularly where children are accompanied to or from school on foot or in the car by a parent.

I invite parents/carers to complete a short survey online to give your views about this issue. The survey is available via School Spider. The survey will remain open until 5pm on Monday 21st July. I appreciate that this is a busy time of the school year but I ask as many families as possible to complete the survey so I can obtain a rounded view of parental opinion.

Thank you in advance for completing the survey and contributing to this review.

#### **School Food Group**

Representatives from the School Food Group met with Richard Scott from Edsential on Tuesday morning.

Edsential is the company which provides our school meals service. Mr Scott visited our school to meet with the Food Group to provide feedback based on the surveys we have conducted this year regarding school meals. In addition to this, pupils reviewed and discussed the revised menu which will be available from September 2025.

Oscar H (Y3), Molly T (Y4), Eli W, Ivy M and Noah B (Y5) managed the meeting with Mr Scott with maturity, presenting the feedback with sensitivity. Christine Darwen, our governor with responsibility for Food Standards in school, was highly impressed by the manner in which the children represented the wider school family.

The Food Group will present the revised lunch menu to families and to the whole school in an assembly in due course.




On Thursday, two gifted Year 6 pupils had the opportunity to meet Olympian Oliver Hynds.

#### **An Amazing Presentation**

We were treated to a wonderful presentation by one of our Year three pupils this week. Connie brought in a bag full of exciting things to show us. Connie's treasures relating to her great grandfather, Neil Franklin. Connie told us of this life story and we were enthralled by his experiences playing football for England between 1946-1950.

Neil Franklin is considered one of England's greatest defenders. He played for several clubs including Stoke City, Hull City, Crewe Alexandra, Stockport County and Macclesfield Town. He was capped by England 37 times before he moved to play for a team in Columbia, South America. Connie showed us books which had been written by and also about her great grandfather and his career. She showed us an array of photographs of Neil Franklin in action and during key points in his career, like when he moved to Columbia. Connie had also drawn a picture of him to show us what he looked like in his kit.

Best of all, Connie showed us two of the England caps that Neil Franklin had earned playing in international fixtures against Scotland and Italy.

She told us that, although he had played for his country 37 times, 11 of these games were during the war. As the silk was needed to make parachutes for the war effort, he did not receive caps for these 11 games. Year six were able to link this information to their work on World War two and how supplies were rationed during the war.

Pupils were so interested to see Neil Franklin's caps that Connie ended up visiting every class so that children could have a closer look.

Parents and carers are welcome to join us on their children's Sports Days and cheer along.


Please ensure that all children come to school every day with a water bottle, cap and wearing sun cream (weather dependent).


