Catering Changes

From Monday 1st September, the cost of school meals for paying pupils in Key Stage 2 (Years 3 – 6) will be £2.90. School dinners are payable in advance via the School Gateway app.

Children in Reception, Years 1 and 2 are entitled to a free school lunch under the Universal Free School Meal Scheme.

Families with children in Key Stage 2 who are receiving any of the following benefits, may be also entitled to Free School Meals:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Class based worship

This week, in our class based worship, we have been looking at the news story about Yuliia Brykailo who moved to the Isle of Man with her daughter, Veronika, after fleeing the war in Ukraine. Yuliia has written a book, Veronika's Treasure Adventures based on her daughter's experience of settling in to a new school.

We discussed the British Values of mutual respect and tolerance, that we all have the right to feel safe, happy and be ourselves and that when we help others to make friends and settle in a new place, we support their freedom too. We also discussed race as the protected characteristic, exploring how we are all different, but as we help others to feel welcome, we are helping them to feel respected, valued and safe.

The bible verse for our worship was

Mark 12:31 Love your neighbour as yourself.

Questions you might like to ask your child:

- How did it feel when you first started at school? What helped you to feel happy and settled?
- What can you do to help someone feel welcomed and part of your school or community?
- What might happen if someone did not feel welcomed or included?

What advice would you give to someone who was moving or joining a new school?

The three support options are:

Information and Advice

Support with finding activities in the community that can provide children and young people with an activity and where practical support is not required (such as personal care or medication). We now also signpost to other short break commissioned services and provision which may provide support with personal requirements.

Practical Support

Support for children and young people to attend an activity group that they would like to attend. 1-1 Support would be offered for a time limited period to assist the activity provider to introduce children and young people to the group to make sure they can take part.

This provider support could include access to training, mentoring or guidance to complete support plans and risk assessments.

Funding

Access to funding to pay for an activity which meets the interests of children and young people and provides a short break for parents/carers and siblings.

Who can use the service?

To use the service children and young people must live in Cheshire West and Chester and receive either disability living allowance (DLA Middle or High Rate) or a personal independence payment (PIP Standard or Enhanced Rate) and not receive any funded support from Social Care.

Our Community Connections service is commissioned by Cheshire West and Chester Council.
