

Academy Conversion Update

Parents and carers will be aware that over many years, the Governing Board has worked hard to support the long-term success of our school. During the last academic year, a consultation exercise involving all stakeholders was undertaken regarding a proposal for our school to convert to an academy within a new multi-academy trust being set up by the Diocese of Chester, Chester Diocesan Learning Trust (CDLT).

The Diocese of Chester recognise the strength and success of our school. Over recent years, we have seen the implementation of systems, relentless drive to enrich learning opportunities and the development of leadership capacity which have supported excellent outcomes for pupils and commendations of our work by external agencies including SIAMS and Ofsted.

Families are aware that in our January 2025 inspection, improvement across all areas of the school inspection framework was noted. The inspection validated that the school had significantly improved beyond the Good Ofsted judgement we attained in October 2019.

As a founding school of CDLT, we have been instrumental in developing the vision, and shaping policies and systems for the new trust, alongside several other highly successful schools in Cheshire and the Wirral.

Conversion to academy status will not cause changes to our own school vision and ways of working with our children and their families. Chester Diocese Learning Trust is committed to ensuring that the successful teams, systems and relationships at the schools continue for the benefit of all pupils. Already, increased collaboration between CDLT partners has supported the enhancement of approaches we take to ensure that all children and staff are able to shine brightly.

Following careful consideration of the options available for securing our school's future success and the outcome of the consultation exercise, the Governing Board took the decision to proceed with conversion with the CDLT Trust.

At the present time, the date for our conversion has not been finalised although I anticipate that this will happen during this term.

I will keep parents and carers posted about the exciting developments which will spring from our collaboration with the other successful schools in our family.

National Assessments

Pupils in some year groups will face national assessments during this academic year. It is vital that children are in school every day as fully possible.

Please continue to avoid taking holidays during term-time to ensure that pupils are not missing sequences of learning.

Year 6

Year 6 face the national SAT tests during the week beginning Monday 11th May 2026. The test timetable for this year is as follows:

Monday 11th May - Grammar Punctuation & Spelling Paper 1 & Paper 2 Tuesday 12th May - Reading

Wednesday 13th May - Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic) & Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning – problem solving) Thursday 14th May - Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning – problem solving)

Please ensure that your child is present all week for these examinations which are undertaken under formal examination conditions and are externally marked.

Year 4

All Year 4 children will be participating in the multiplication tables check (MTC) in June 2026. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics.

This is an online test which will be undertaken during the two-week period beginning on Monday 1st June 2026.

Parents can help children to prepare for this test by ensuring that they are learning their times tables and using Times Tables Rockstar to practise. If your child has lost their TT Rockstars login, please contact their teacher as soon as possible.

Year 2

Year 2 also take a series of tests during the month of May. These tests are completed in school and are marked by the class teacher.

The Year 2 tests inform teachers' assessments of the progress your child has made across Key Stage one (Year 1 and 2) in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

Year 1 (and Year 2 pupils who did not pass the check last year)

Year 1 pupils will take the national Phonics Screening Check during the week beginning Monday 8th June 2026. This test requires children to use their phonics knowledge to read forty words. The pass mark last year was 32.

Children in Year two who did not pass the phonics screening test last year, when they were in Year one, will retake the phonics test during the same week (beginning 8th June).

Reception

The national baseline assessment is completed within the first six weeks of school.

In addition to this, we also complete our own internal school assessment to identify strengths and areas for development for every child in Reception. These are communicated to parents and carers with an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) developed. Your child's ILP will be shared with you during Parents' Evenings during week beginning 20th October 2025. Information about booking Parents' Evenings appointments will follow in due course.

Information about assessment in Reception has been provided following the Meet the Teacher meetings last week. If you have any questions, please speak to a member of the Reception team.

The Early Years foundation profile assessment is undertaken towards the end of this academic year. Information from this assessment supports the transition of pupils into Year one.

YEAR 6

Year 6 Bikeability

Bikeability is a national cycling training programme for children and adults in the UK. Bike Right will be visiting us in November to carry out the level 1 and level 2 training to those children who sign up in Year 6. Bikeability training is encouraged for those pupils who cycle to school already or who will be when they move on to High School.

Level 1 training consits of off-road, basic skills like preparing for a ride, controlling the cycle, and pedalling with confidence.

Level 2 training takes place on quiet roads, teaching more confidence with turns, passing parked vehicles, understanding road signs and signals, and negotiating junctions.

Letters and sign up forms were sent home before we broke up for the summer holidays. If your Year 6 child would like to participate in the training and you haven't already returned your completed form, please do so before the end of September so that we can coordinate the lessons. If you have misplaced yours, spare forms are available at the the School Office.

The bank is run by pupils from the school and overseen by Miss Rennocks. Should children wish to withdraw money this can be done at the Credit Union in Chester. Over the last two years we have seen children's understanding of the choices money offers them increase, children can talk about why they are saving and know that by saving now, they will have more to spend later. It is our hope that by doing this, we are helping children develop habits that will serve them well as adults.


